- Ursprung in Nordamerika
- Verbindung zwischen Menschen mit ungenutzter Grünfläche und denen die gerne im Garten arbeiten würden
- fördert den Anbau von regionalen Nahrungsmitteln
- Einführung städtischer Landwirtschaft
- Community Garden

Die Grundidee von garden sharing

- 40% der Nordamerikaner haben keine eigene Grünfläche, die sie besitzen lassen diese oft unbenutzt
- jeder bekommt den Zutritt zu lokalen, gesunden, frischen und biologisch angebauten Nahrungsmitteln
- die entstehenden Kosten (Bewässerung, Geräte, Pflanzensamen etc.) werden untereinander geteilt, sowie die Ernte
- soziale Kontakte mit gleichem Interesse
- das Internet wird als Verständigungsplattform für garden sharing Initiativen genutzt
- die Organisationen sind meistens kostenlos und werbefrei

Vorteile von garden sharing

- verstärkt die Eigenständigkeit
- soziale Mitarbeit– gesellschaftliche Entwicklung
- produziert gesunde und nahrhafte Lebensmittel
- ermöglicht eine entspannte Freizeittätigkeit
- Instandhaltung der Grünflächen
- verschönert die Nachbarschaft
- verringert die Kosten für Nahrungsmittel
- Ökonomisch, Einsparung der Ressourcen

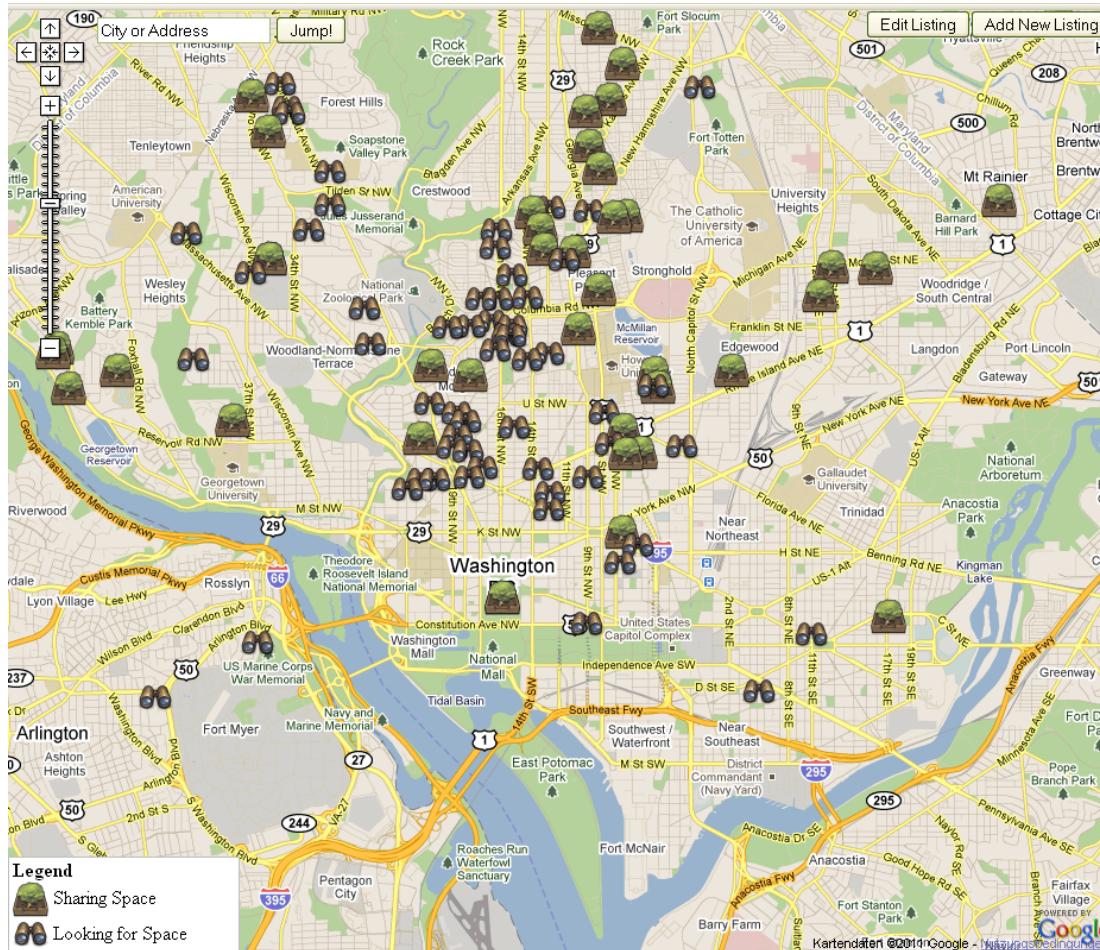

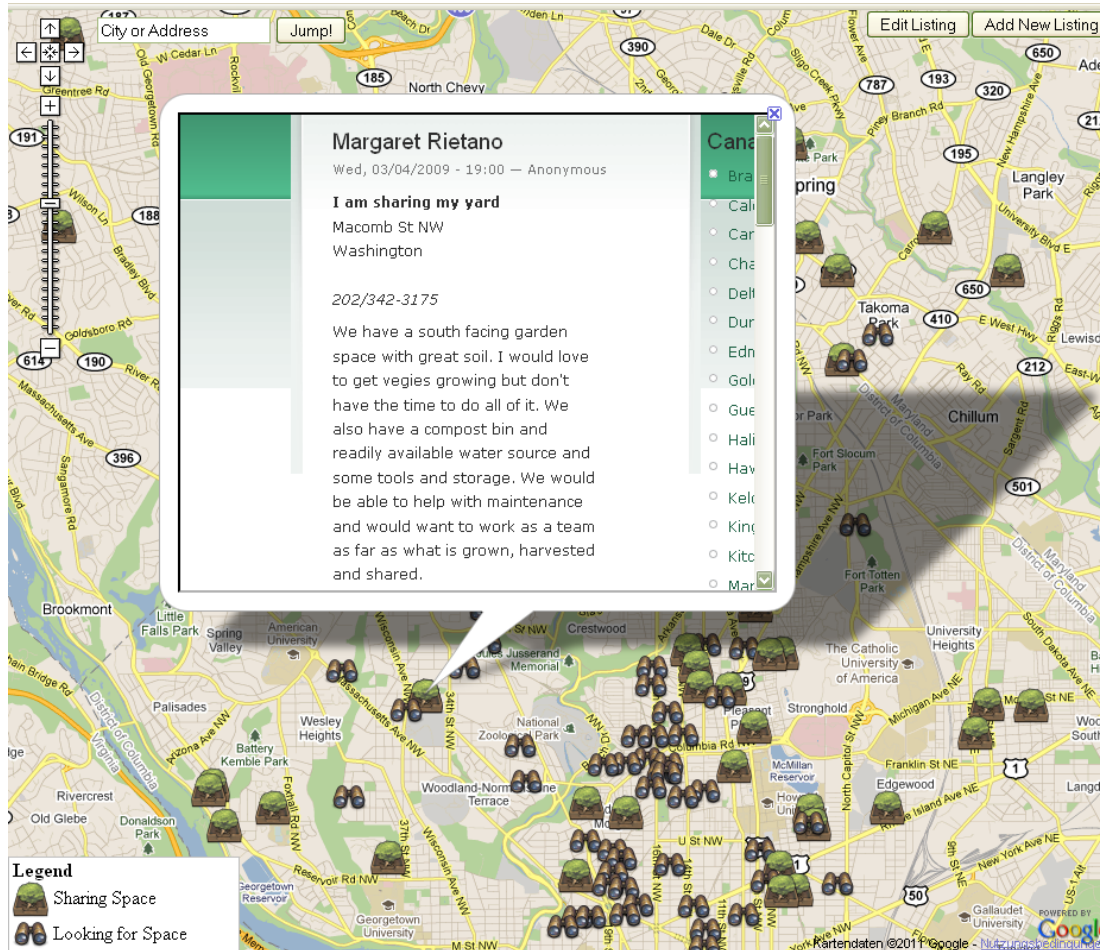
